

Under 30 Seconds



In less than 30 seconds, a thief can use shatter a car window, reach inside, unlock the door, and remove your valuables. In about 30 seconds, you can secure valuables and prevent this from happening to you.

Breaking into a car is a crime of an opportunity. Any thief passing by can see whatever you leave inside. A thief who sees valuables (brief cases, CDs, cell phones, cigarettes, garage door openers, keys, loose change, GPS, Luggage, mp3 players, purses, prescriptions, sporting equipment, sunglasses, and Shopping Bags) could easily smash a window, grab portable items, and be gone before you even know what happened.
